New Bird Feeding Station at Farnham Gravel Pit

Following the closure of the site during the pandemic and a winter of little attention the feeding station had fallen into disrepair. For many years June Atkinson has maintained the station but it was on sloping ground which posed a significant risk of slips when waterlogged and slippery. In autumn 2021 the feeders were repositioned and refurbished by some of the management team and Paul Birtwhistle and we were ready to see what would visit. Gradually a variety of birds returned, some RSPB Red Listed needing all the help they can get. Paul topped up the feeders daily and photographed the birds. These can be seen on the HDNS website's Sighting Page.

We are now very pleased to announce that Joan McClean has offered to sponsor the feeding station in memory of her late husband, Jack. Many will remember Jack and his obituary can be read in the 2020 Annual Report. Jack loved natural history in all its forms and was a very active HDNS member, working as part of the Farnham Management Team for many years. Joan was also General Secretary for 8 years. Both Joan and Jack were given life membership in recognition of their contribution to the Society. Joan's generous donation will enable the feeding station to develop and run for many years to come and allow members to enjoy it as we know Jack would have done. We are very grateful to Joan and it is wonderful to be able to assist the birds to feed up over the winter months.

Many thanks to Paul for being so enthusiastic in setting up the station and many thanks to Joan for ensuring its future, in Jack's name, for years to come.
